Checklist Before the conference

- *Schedule a time to meet. If you can't go at the scheduled time, ask the teacher about other times.
 - *Review your child's work, grades, and progress reports.
- *Talk with your child about his or her progress in school.
- *Talk with others—family members, after school staff, mentors, etc.— about your child's strengths and needs.
 - *Make a list of questions to ask during the conference.
- *Think about ways you would like to be involved in your child's learning so that you can discuss them with the teacher.

QUESTIONS YOU MAY WANT TO ASK

- 1. How well does my child get along with other children? Who seem to be my child's best friends?
- 2. How does my child get along with other children? What methods do you use to promote self-discipline?
- 3. Does my child select books at the proper reading level from the library?
- 4. Does my child use study periods effectively?
- 5. Are there any skills you are working on at school that we might reinforce at home?
- 6. Do you expect me to help my child with homework?
- 7. Are there any areas in which my child needs special help?
- 8. Does my child display any special interests or talents at school that we might support at home?
- Does my child seem to be self-confident, happy, and secure? If not, what do you think the home or school can do to increase my child's feelings of self-worth?



Questions I May Ask

- How does your child seem to feel about school?
- Which activities does your child talk about at home?
- 3. Which activities seem to stimulate your child's intellectual growth?
- 4. How does your child spend free time?
- 5. Is there anything that your child dreads?
- 6. What are your child's interests and hobbies?
